THE OHIO SPECIALIZED DOCKETS PRACTITIONER NETWORK

With over 100 specialized dockets in operation throughout Ohio, the Supreme Court of Ohio, the Ohio Department of Alcohol and Drug Addiction Services and the Ohio Department of Mental Health have recognized the need for interaction among the professionals that staff these courts. In order to provide such a forum, the Ohio Specialized Docket Practitioner Network was created to provide peer support and technical assistance to these programs. The Network is comprised of several sub-networks that meet by discipline. These sub-network meetings allow specialized docket practitioners to discuss the challenges and successes they have faced in their specific role on the specialized docket court team. In addition, the sub-network meetings offer opportunities for specialized docket professionals to provide program updates, discuss program operations, and discover innovative and effective strategies employed by other specialized dockets. BROWN V. STATE OF MARYLAND

In an April issue of the newsletter, there was an article related to a constitutional challenge of the operation of the Baltimore City Adult Felony Drug Court brought by the State Public Defender. Two arguments were made to the Court of Appeals, the state's highest court. First, that Maryland's problem-solving courts lack fundamental jurisdiction. Second, that the Baltimore Drug Court violated double jeopardy rules by sentencing an offender for violating probation after already having served a jail sentence for violating a drug court rule resulting from the same act. On May 18, the Court ruled that the Baltimore City Adult Felony Drug Court does not lack fundamental jurisdiction. With no comment on the claim, the Court ruled that the double jeopardy argument was not preserved for appellate rule by the Court because the issue was not made in the lower circuit court.
