## Funding

### STATE JUSTICE INSTITUTE (SJI) GRANTS

**Application Deadlines: February 1, May 1 And August 1, 2019**

The State Justice Institute (SJI) is announcing the availability of five grant categories for state courts, nonprofits, and educational assistance to judges. The categories are as follows:

Project Grants (up to \$300,000 each with dollar-to-dollar match required) to support innovative education and training, demonstration, and technical assistance projects to improve the administration of justice in the nation's courts.

Technical Assistance (TA) Grants (up to \$50,000 each; applicants required to match not less than 50% of the grant amount requested, of which 20% must be cash) to provide state and local courts with funding to obtain expert assistance to diagnose a problem, develop a response to that problem, and initiate implementation of any needed changes.

Curriculum Adaptation and Training (CAT) Grants (\$30,000 each; applicants are required to match not less than 50% of the grant amount requested, of which 20% must be cash) to enable courts to modify and adapt or revise curriculum, train instructors, pilot test the new or revised curriculum, and conduct judicial branch education and training programs.

Strategic Initiatives Grants (SIG) awards are of varying amounts; these grants are initiated by SJI outside the regular grant process. Recent grants have gone for pressing issues, including handling of immigration and human-trafficking cases.

Education Support Program (ESP) to provide tuition assistance for state court judges and court managers (\$1,000 awards).

The nine funding priorities for FY 2019 are Opioids and the State Court Response, Human Trafficking and the State Courts, Guardianship/Conservatorship/Elder Issues, Juvenile Justice Reform, Improving Court Operations, Fines/Fees/Bail Practices, Civil Justice in the 21st Century, Self-Represented Litigants, and Language/Access and the State Courts.

## SUICIDE PREVENTION LIFELINE CRISIS CENTER FOLLOW-UP EXPANSION GRANT PROGRAM

### Application Due Date: March 11, 2019

SAMHSA is accepting applications for Suicide Prevention Lifeline Crisis Center Follow-Up Expansion Grant Program (Crisis Center Follow-Up Expansion). The purpose of this program is to provide an integrated hub that:

1. Ensures systematic follow-up of suicidal persons who contact an NSPL Crisis Center.
2. Provides enhanced coordination of crisis stabilization, crisis respite, and hospital emergency department services.
3. Enhances coordination with mobile on-site crisis response.

In effect, with the resources provided, the hub should not lose track of a person in a suicidal crisis as they interface with crisis systems. It is expected that this program will promote continuity of care to safeguard the well-being of individuals who are at risk of suicide.

SAMHSA plans to issue 2 grants of up to \$336,192 per year for up to 3 years.
