

JUDGMENT ENTRY

Based upon the various Declarations of Emergency made by the State of Ohio and United States Federal Government as a consequence of the COVID-19 public health crisis, and in order to protect the public, Court staff, and maintain safe and efficient operations, pursuant to Rule 5(A)(2) of the Rules of Superintendence for Ohio Courts, the following is ordered effective immediately:


1. All preliminary hearings, pretrials, trials, status conferences, and pleas, assigned a criminal felony, criminal misdemeanor, or traffic case number, on which a waiver of applicable time limits has been signed by the defendant, scheduled from March 24, 2020 through May 31, 2020, are continued. The Clerk of Court shall coordinate the rescheduling of all such cases and notice shall be sent to each defendant, and legal counsel of record, of that new hearing date.
2. In all cases where there exists no waiver of applicable waiver of time requirements, that matter shall remain scheduled as previously set.
3. Except where a waiver of time limits may exist, felony cases and domestic violence cases shall be scheduled within applicable time limits for such criminal matters. Likewise, any misdemeanor criminal or traffic cases, on which there is no waiver or time limits by a defendant, those matters shall be scheduled in accordance with applicable statutes.
4. All civil cases currently pending before the court and scheduled between March 24, 2020 and May 31, 2020, are continued to a date to be set after June 1, 2020. The Clerk of Court shall coordinate the rescheduling of all civil matters, and send notice to all parties and legal counsel of record. All civil matters filed subsequent to the date of this order, and prior to May 31, 2020, shall be scheduled subsequent to June 1, 2020.
5. As it relates to all individuals currently on community control through prior sentence of the Court, the Court's probation officer is hereby granted discretion and authority to change reporting requirements from in-person to telephonic or electronic reporting. For all new matters including community control as a sanction, initial intake shall be conducted by the probation officer in person; however, thereafter she shall possess discretion and authority to set all manner of reporting.
6. Effective immediately, and subject to subsequent review and revision by the Court, all community service sanctions and functions are suspended.
7. The Court reserves the right to limit the number of individuals present in the Courtroom in the interest of public health and safety.

This policy shall remain in effect, subject to further revision by the Court, or until it is determined by the Court that the COVID-19 emergency has abated.

This order shall be served on: the Supreme Court of Ohio, the Seventh District Court of Appeals, the Mahoning County Court of Common Pleas (including each division of same), the Youngstown Municipal Court, the Struthers Municipal Court, the Mahoning County Courts, the Mahoning County Bar Association, the Mahoning County Sheriff, the Mahoning County Clerk of Courts, the Mahoning County Health Department, and the Daily Legal News, the City of Campbell, Coitsville Township, the Campbell Police Department, the Coitsville Police Department, and the State Highway Patrol (Canfield Post).
